Why a camp at "the place of singing waters"? One can imagine the beauty of this bouldered plateau being a Crow encampment site for hunting elk in the fields to the north and moose in the marshes to the south. We know the stories of trappers who set up their trap lines along the mountainside. During the bustling mining years up in Independence, this was near the half-way area between McLeod and the mines, where a lot of Saturday night revelry occurred. In 1930, some church groups from eastern Montana came to set up the church camp that has occupied this bouldered plateau ever since.

Those first campers braved cold and rain because there was something about being together along the river that deepened their appreciation of each other and of God. So close were people to God, that this was often where baptisms happened. and too where ashes were scattered. Lives were dedicated, calls to live in faith were accepted, and commitments to marriage were vowed at Mimanagish.

The "where" of this place called Minanagish in our lives has a way of making it into those stories that tell the "why" of Mimanagish. Could it be that the "why" of Mimanagish is that we are a people who long to be close to what is sacred?

Such as being quieted from the roar of the modern life by the roar of ancient waters.

Such as finding ourselves in such gentle conversation with others that there is time for the silence to be punctuated by squeaking pine branches.


Such as letting go of everyday pretenses and technologies to find the inner goodness that had been hidden by our facades.

Such as observing a creation that allows us an existence and a way to fit in to it.

This 2019 summer camp season is being offered because we know why it is necessary for us to be together in outdoor ministries. Great work goes into making camp happen because we know why it is worth it. Of course, the "where" makes a difference but our eye is on the "why."

3. The Conference will offer transformative experiences and have an active presence in places where we are not now present.

There are now ten clergy among us, in addition to the Conference Minister, who are trained in coaching leaders and small groups. Coaches are trained to do the deep listening and ask the right questions. Coaches can help persons find their own best answers and directions for life and leadership questions. Coaches are available at no cost to your church and mission work for 30-minute sessions. They will demonstrating their coaching technique around issues of stewardship at our May 4 "What about Stewardship?" gatherings.
