God-seeds, reflections from Marc Stewart

Look down the hill from the Old Rugged Cross museum (yes, there is such a thing). There is a grove of trees below with heavy underbrush. It used to be a revival camp meeting place a hundred years ago. Even when I tromped around the place in 1981 it was hard to find the evidence that church happened there. Cheryl's really old Reed City, Michigan relatives remembered the meeting grounds by a huge, 4 foot diameter ceramic crock at an artesian wellhead.

One great aunt even did a chalk drawing of the place.

Cheryl and I did find it. A chunk was cracked off the edge and the water in it was stagnant.



Thirty years later, when we were back, the area had been turned into a city park and there was no sign of the well left. There is now a long pond with a wooden swinging

Over a hundred years from church camp times, of which many of our churches in Montana also share a common history, religious expression has changed. Now, many of our churches take at least one Sunday a year and go to a town park for public worship, shared food, and lawn games... at least that is what we do at First Church Billings. A sense of openness and welcome also pervades what happens within our church buildings, where all are welcome. And in the in-between spaces, we recognize that God's gift is not just ours to give, but also ours to receive from those we meet along the way. We know blessings are not something we have to call people out to receive, but rather something received together and in each other.

I do not view the MT-NWy Conference as a promoter of museum-quality religion (though I am glad to maintain important documents in our archives). In the UCC, each church is responsible for discerning its faith expression in its community and beyond. Together, though, we have come to know that it is our expressions of faith with others, our finding blessings in others, our strengthened congregational life through others...are the truly significant ways of living for the sake of the Gospel.

Our eNews has focused on our Conference priorities for the past year, and will continue to do so. The Conference Board of Directors developed these mission priorities and has honed them for the year ahead. Keep posted through eNews, even refer back to previous issues on our WEB archive, and see how you are part of a faith that is vital to churches and is transforming lives.



developed. Following the model of the S.California-Nevada Conference, we will train clergy and lay leaders to be leadership coaches. Up to 10 people will be funded to take the certificate training course. These trained coaches will be asked to provide up to 100 hours, each, of coaching within our Conference. Master coach, and S.Cal.-Nev. Conference Minister, Rev. Dr. Felix Villanueva, will offer an introductory day on February 2 in Big Timber, and a week-long course at the Ursuline Center in Great Falls, March 18-22. Additional information and registration materials will be emailed by the end of October. This Coaching for Clergy training is credentialed by the International Coaching Federation.

2. The Conference will be appropriately staffed and the staff will be justly compensated.

Four Mimanagish summer counselors have been added into our camp budget for 2019. This will provide some program stability and additional camper safety. They will have a week of training before the youth camps. Application materials will be ready by January 2019.

3. The Conference will offer transformative experiences and have an active presence in places where we are not now present.

<u>Disaster Response</u> sent from through the UCC national setting during the 3rd quarter of 2018

- \$55,000 more for Puerto Rico recovery following Hurricane Maria, bringing its total to more than \$267,000*, not counting in-kind and volunteer labor. Work teams have restored 35 houses since June! Includes \$5,000 to help ship medical equipment to Puerto Rico for Ryder Memorial Hospital.
- \$50,000 more to Volusia Interfaiths/Agencies Networking in Disaster (VIND) for the continued employment of a construction supervisor for long-term recovery from Hurricanes Matthew and Irma.
- \$40,000 to assist 910 Kenyan households (7,300 people) displaced by spring floods.
- \$30,000 more for Hurricane Irma and Maria recovery in St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands, bringing UCC Disaster Ministries' cash contribution to this ecumenical recovery effort to \$175,000.
- \$60,435 more for Hurricane Harvey recovery in Port Arthur, Texas, about half of that for the salary of the coordinator of UCC Disaster Ministries' Hurricane Harvey Recovery program.
- \$5,500 to assist households affected by the eruption of the Fuego volcano in Guatemala.
- \$5,000 for Hurricane Irma long-term recovery in Palm Beach, Fla.
- \$3,000 toward flood relief for eight families who suffered significant damages and losses from flooding in April in Kauai, Hawai'i.
- \$3,000 for the United Church of Christ in Japan as it responds to severe flooding and other damage from Typhoon Maria in July, and subsequent heat and dust.
- \$5,000 for Indonesia following the July earthquake that killed at least 14, injured at least 160 and damaged about 1,000 homes.
- \$5,000 for the Church of South India following floods in August, due to incessant rain, which have taken a heavy toll of life and property. At least 324 died and 220,000 were displaced. The funds will be used to provide relief assistance to 3,800 affected households.
- \$3,000 to IMA World Health for its work in the Democratic Republic of Congo to help contain this summer's new Ebola outbreak in North Kivu Province. Funds will be used for personal protective equipment and training for local staff to help stop the disease's spread.

* Another \$168,000 is being sent in September to our partner Iglesia Evangelica Unida de Puerto Rico for a program of Emotional and Spiritual Care and Trauma Recovery, and for its Recovery Project, bringing the funds disbursement total to \$435,000.
