

In 2016 the Conference received a \$100,000 gift from Plentywood UCC when the church closed and sold its building. Our Board directed this gift into salaries for the Conference office and Camp Mimanagish. Jennifer Penfield was hired as our full-time Conference Administrator, and Josie Caton was hired as our ³/₄ time professional camp director. Mimanagish added a facilities director and increased its kitchen staff compensation.

A 2008 advisory council team advised that Mimanagish move towards a professional staff, but it took until 2016 to find the money for this. The Board of Directors felt that a staff investment could strengthen and build up camp usage. This Mimanagish Annual Expense chart shows the change in staff compensation.

In a previous decade, the MT-NWy Conference UCC received an "essential conference ministries" grant from the UCC to fund our associate staff. Until 2008, this grant paid for Associate Conference Minister, Rev. Michael Obenauer. This position provided significant oversight of Camp Mimanagish. The end of the "essential conference ministries" grant marked the first time the MT-NWy Conference no longer received "mission support" from the national UCC.

Through 2016, Mimanagish staff were minimally compensated, even as they put

doing director and managing type work for Mimanagish. These unsung heroes enabled the Committee for Outdoor Ministries to manage with annual deficits under \$30,000 that could be met by church fundraisers and "Friends of Mimanagish" giving.

Our Montana Northern Wyoming Conference is challenged to live out its second mission priority with Camp Mimanagish: "to adequately staff the Conference to appropriately compensate staff." Staffing for sustainability means that we need to staff for growth. Mimanagish needs a minimum of 20 campers per night to meet its current costs, or 2400 camper/night per season. The Mimanagish Annual Fee and Sales Income shows that camper income has decreased \$10,000 over the past 4 years. Keep in mind that this is despite an increase in fees.



As has been done every year, the Committee for Outdoor Ministries is pulling out all the stops to increase camper registration. We have also hired a staff person, Rev. Cathy Barker, with 400 hours dedicated through June to recruiting partner organizations into Mimamagish.

For this coming season, COM created 4 summer positions paying \$1000 honorariums for cabin counselor/assistants. The Committee for Outdoor Ministries is recruiting through a variety of young adult and college places, including the UCC Summer Communities of Service intern program. We are also in a process to receive a summer VISA/AmeriCorp volunteer. COM chairperson, Trudi Downer, has offered to fill the Mimanagish Program Director position for 2019 as a volunteer. She will also lead the Communities of Service intern program at camp.

primary issue. Giving consideration to our ability to meet staffing needs will require us to look with fresh eyes at what it really takes to successfully staff Mimanagish.






Camp Mimanagish is a sacred wilderness sanctuary where we engage in spirit, community and creation.

Is there a "one size fits all" for church stewardship? No, but there are some common approaches. Stewardship Task Force

The Stewardship Task Force is offering simultaneous East/Central area and West area church gatherings on May 4, 10:30 am to 2:30 pm, at Plymouth UCC Helena and at Mayflower UCC Billings.

What About Stewardship? will be the theme for our time together for sharing stories and ideas about how churches financially support their ministries. Plans include an inspirational speaker, fellowship and meal, and sharing time. Rev. Sue Artt, Conference Minister with the Rocky Mountain Conference, will keynote the Helena gathering. Rev. Shana Johnson, Conference Minister with the Illinois South Conference, will keynote the Billings gathering.

Churches are encouraged to bring at least 3 - 4 members. Recruit now and save the May 4 date. More information will be sent by late March.

2. The Conference and Churches will be appropriately staffed and the staff will be justly compensated.


The Mimanagish Budgeted Expenses chart in the God-seed article above has a disclaimer "these personnel expenses do not include \$40,000 - \$60,000 of annual office time." The Board of Directors has allocated \$44,000 of administrative expenses (see line 5.4.990) for 2019 after allocating \$60,000 in 2018. This amount pays for a salary portion of the Conference staff to support the work of Camp Mimanagish. Our Conference Administrator, Jennifer Penfield, sometimes devotes half of her time to Camp, and our Conference Minister devotes about a quarter time to camp. The support work of Jennifer and Marc includes WEB development, registrations, COM support, program support, staff recruitment and support, and grant writing.



3. The Conference will offer transformative experiences and have an active presence in places where we are not now present.

The Conference has received three grants totaling \$25,000 this year that mesh with our third mission priority:

- 1. Margaret Ping Foundation Grant for \$5000 for Mimanagish scholarships to children and families impacted by poverty. Churches are encourged to identify children, youth, and families that can be awarded scholarships to attend a Mimanagish camp.
- 2. Neighbors in Need grant from the National UCC for \$5000 to support our second year of PRIDE Camp.
- 3. Essential Conference Ministry grant for \$15,000 to share with the Central Pacific Conference and Pacific North West Conference in bringing together 6-member teams to consider what ministries might be shared across our three conferences.



Campers need to <u>register</u> for their youth, adult, and family camps as soon as possible. It is urgent that we receive registrations early this year for the 2019 season. Our decision making for this year's season required your Conference Board to set some benchmarks, including registrations benchmarks.

Minimum camp enrollment has been set at 20. That means that there need to be 20 paid campers in order for each camp to be held. Staffing and planning needs necessitate us to set an April 1 deadline to assess the viability of each camp. Your early registration will help us successfully plan for a 2019 camp season.
