February, 2022 *Notes from the Sky Pilot's Page* Red Lodge, Montana

There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. Galatians 3: 28

As I contemplated the topic for my Sky Pilot's Page this month, I vacillated between writing about "love" or about "COVID." I decided to write about COVID out of my love for all of you and our community.

We are one, we are in unity, we are the unity of the community. That is part of the over-all identity of our church. In our church we welcome a huge spectrum of religious, spiritual, political, and civil beliefs. Anything that we do or say that causes divisiveness and pain within the community harms everyone. That means respecting people's privacy and their choices that they make for themselves. This means not jumping to conclusions about someone's choices and it especially means not sharing our opinions of those conclusions with anyone but God.

For many months now I have been witnessing people's questions of curiosity and hearing statements about people's choices that have vilified people for those choices. I am speaking specifically about COVID vaccinations, diagnosis, mitigation, and treatment options. To you, the Body of Christ, I say this: "Stop. Just stop." Stop judging people for whether or not they are vaccinated. Stop sharing publicly your assumptions of people's COVID diagnosis. Stop judging people for their choices in COVID treatment and mitigation options. And for the love of God, stop putting your questions and opinions about other people's COVID situations on public platforms.

You all know how I tend to "change up" scripture, because it was written 2000 years ago and here we are in 2022 looking for God's Word in our midst. To this Galatians text I would add, "Either vaxxed or unvaxxed, masked or unmasked, all of us are one in Christ Jesus." I feel that it is time to remind ourselves that we are part of the *whole* community, standing alongside people who think and choose differently than us *regarding this virus*. We have allowed ourselves, in our panic, to fall victim to our own judgements. And in that panic, we have publicly shamed, ridiculed, and judged our fellow human beings. How, I ask, is that lifting and exalting the Body of Christ? How is that embracing the unity that we so vehemently protect, support, and preach about?

Our church has unofficially adopted the song "All Are Welcome" as our theme song. Too often I find myself feeling like "All are welcome... as long as you feel the same way that we do about COVID." We do not all feel the same way about COVID. Just like we do not all feel the same way about God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, The Lord's Prayer, political agendas, education, or the weather. We are not a cookie cutter congregation – we are a Community Church where our diversity is in our cultures. Our mission is to "Welcome *all* people to gather for worship, fellowship and to study God's word. We seek to be servants of our Lord in the care of *all* people." We are a welcoming and caring community through the love and grace of Jesus Christ. It is time to remind ourselves that it is through that love and grace that we are strengthened and nurtured so that we can extend that love and grace to *all*.

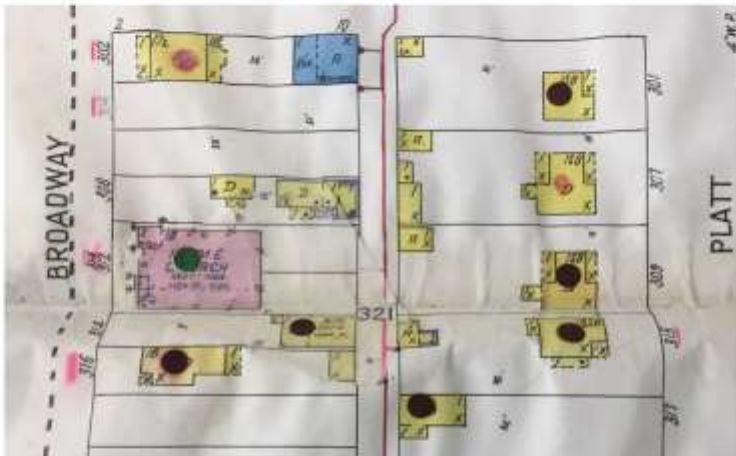

Notes on our Church's History from Facilities Management: February 2022.

In the last few articles, we've been looking at some photos from a century and more ago, from our building's earliest days. With this month's photo, we're jumping forward about half a century, to the 1980s. What we are looking at here is a wintry photo taken during the construction of the courtyard and playground on the north side of the church. You can see the big concrete retaining wall after it had been poured and before the weather was warm enough to fill and level the front area for today's landscaping. When we look at this area these days with the big fir tree next to the bell-tower --- the tree is so big it seems like it always has been there.



Actually, that was bare ground up through the 1960s, as we've seen in some of the old black-and-white photo of the building. Back then, there was very little landscaping because the Church building went almost all the way out to the lot lines except at the very back of the property. You can see that in this plot of this block from 1940. The image comes from a



Sanborn Fire Insurance map of Red Lodge on file at the Carbon County Historical Society. The colored dots on the houses denote the utility service – the one on the Church tells us that the Church had natural gas for water heaters and furnaces and that the Church's kitchen had electric stoves. From this map, you can see houses and buildings right up against the Church building on the lots next door on the north and south. Also, you can see the Church's street address was listed at 314 South Broadway in those days.

308 South Broadway was the address for the house next door on the north until RLCC bought and absorbed that property in 1968. For reference, today's kitchen and restroom wing sits where that old house was. The playground area to the north is on the two more lots north of that. Those were owned by the Roman family and were still vacant in 1984 when we purchased them at an estate sale. The property on the corner – now called Gallagher's Irish Rose, was built out to the lot lines which is why our playground seems to be walled off by the Gallaghers' basement and garage foundation walls

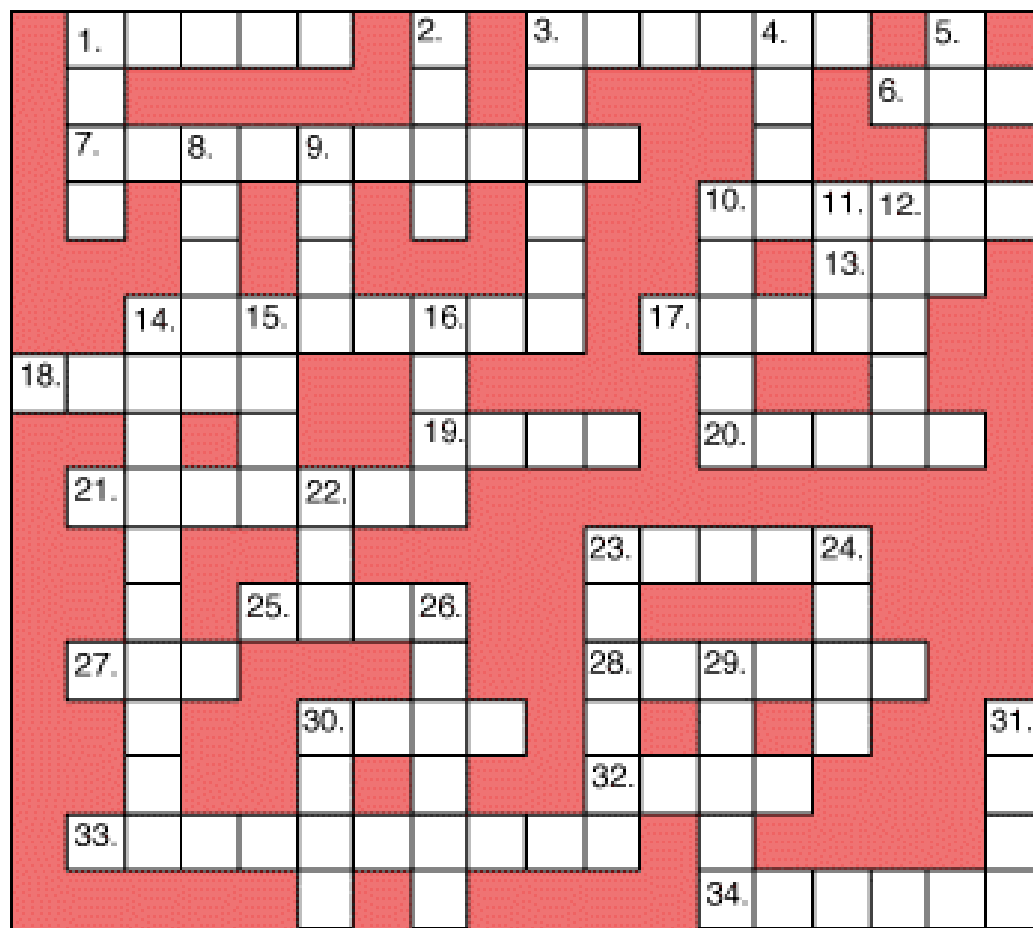

“A pastor of a small church would occasionally call on one gentleman to pray, and every time this one particular guy would pray, he would end with the strangest statement, “And, oh Lord, prop us up on our leaning side.”

Finally, the pastor pulled him aside, and he said, “I love the way you pray, but I don’t understand your little closing phrase. What are you talking about – prop us up on our leaning side?” He responded, “Well, Pastor, I’m a farmer. I live out on the farm and, you know, I live in the country. I’ve got an old barn, and it’s been there a long time. It’s been through a lot of weather, and a lot of storms, and a lot of bugs have eaten at it.”

He said, “I got to looking at it one day when I was riding on my tractor, and I noticed that it was leaning to one side. So I thought to myself, oh my goodness! The barn is leaning, and it’s a matter of time before the whole thing falls.

He continued, “So, you know what I did? I went and got some pine beams, and I propped it up on its leaning side.” He said, “It still leans, and probably always will. He concluded, “From time to time, I find myself leaning. Leaning toward my old desires, leaning toward anger, leaning toward becoming bitter or hateful at the people who are bugging me, or leaning toward going back to the old habits and the old life I used to have. And when I feel myself start to lean toward that tendency, I just remember that old barn, and I pray out loud - “Lord, thank you for propping me up on the leaning side.”
